

n August 10, 2010, David and Christine Phillips
lost their 8 year old daughter, Aine, due to undiagnosed Pulmonary Veno Occlusive Disease (PVOD).

Their younger daughter, Bella, was five at the time. What they discovered through this tragedy was the need for ongoing support groups for the surviving siblings to help them with the grieving process.

David and Christine envisioned a permanent center where children struggling with the loss of a sibling or loved one could gain support and interact with other children having the same experience. From this idea, the Friends of Aine Foundation

was established with the primary goal to raise funds to support grieving children, particularly the Good Grief program at Home Health and Hospice Care (HHHC) in Merrimack.

In April of 2013, David and Christine proposed the idea of a kid's try-athlon and within four months, their idea came to fruition. The first Friends of Aine Kids'Try-athlon took place on August 18, 2013, with 200 participants and 80 volunteers. Their efforts were extremely successful. In December 2014, 'The Friends of Aine Foundation presented a \$25,000 check to HHHC. The following year, in October 2015, they presented another \$25,000 to HHHC.

This past August marked the third annual Try-athlon. The Try-athlon is designed specifically for children ages 4-15 years, in memory of Aine. The event started at the Bedford town pool and ended at the Bedford High School. Participants ages 4-10 years swam twenty-five yards, ran a half mile, and biked one mile. Older participants, ages 11-15 years swam fifty yards, ran one mile, and biked two miles. This year's event raised over \$20,000. The community support each year has been amazing.

How can others get involved with this organization? Others can get involved by helping to coordinate fundraisers with us, by volunteering at the fundraisers, helping to spread the word of who we are and what we do, and of course, donations.

How has establishing the Foundation helped you thus far? We get the opportunity to say our daughter's name and honor her memory. And we get to help other

children, like our daughter Bella, who miss their siblings or moms or dads so much.

How long have you lived in the neighhorhood? We've lived here for 15 years and chose it mainly because it felt right and we liked the feeling of community. Since Aine's death, we have come to understand what a truly amazing community we live in, both our neighborhood and the Town of Bedford. We are grateful to be here.
